Hot Water Offline Saturday, October 9

Most of the heating and hot water generation on campus starts at the boiler plant by Violette Hall. From there steam is pumped to the halls to generate heat and hot water. On Saturday, October 9, the University will temporarily shut down the boiler plant so that they can change over to newer, more efficient boilers.

During the shutdown next Saturday, there won't be any steam sent to the halls across campus. At Missouri Hall, this will impact hot water in the bathrooms and kitchens as well as heating in some spaces like the first floor lobbies, cafeteria, and bathrooms. Because MO Hall uses electrical heaters in the room, you can steal heat your room. The change should finish sometime on that Saturday.
